Fieldwork Update

Juan Koponen provided an update on fieldwork in support of the Ordnance and Explosives cleanup program.

- 6 anomalies were investigated with a miniature open front barricade (MOFB, or "budlight") at site OE-SEA.1 along Gen Jim Moore Blvd, which was closed for a short time during the work. Nearby residents were informed prior to the work and were cooperative. Operations went smoothly.
- The Technical Escort Unit is scheduled to arrive in March to assist with the removal of eleven items identified in sites OE-SEA.1-4. Roads may be subject to closure during this work. A press release announcing the details will be made ahead of time.
