# MMRP Fieldwork Update MRS-16

A prescribed burn has been completed on the 79 acre area of MRS-16 in preparation for a removal to depth munitions response. Habitat management transects have been installed to support monitoring of vegetation recovery from the preparatory, prescribed burn, and munitions response actions. Preparatory actions, prescribed burn, surface safety sweep, vegetation removal, surface removal, and subsurface removal are concluded. **QA** is in progress.

#### **ISSUES AND CONCERNS:**

- A 4 plus acre area of high density anomalies remains within the perimeter of the site. Analysis of data collected from sampling of this are indicates that anomalies are buried expended practice rockets and associated debris. Removal of anomalies from this area would require excavation and screening.
- A consultation with BLM is complete reference the LUCs for the 4-plus acre high density area.
- The MRS fence has been removed. A surface designation of the high density anomaly area (fence) is in progress.

## **MMRP Fieldwork Update**

#### PROJECT: MRS-BLM Units 1-5 Removal Action

An MMRP action is scheduled for MRS-BLM Units 1-5 in accordance with the Track 3 ROD. This area is located in the southwestern-most portion of the MRS-BLM. That area is divided into three units of 100+ acres for planning and control. Concurrence of Army's vegetation removal proposal by USF&WS has been received for units 1, 2, and 3. A Technical letter has been published to describe prescribed burn preparatory actions for the regulatory agencies. Vegetation cutting in fuel breaks (Units 2/3) is complete. Further blacklining is possible for Unit 3 (2008). Preparatory actions (access roads and heli pads) continue. Unit 3 is the primary objective for 2008 burn window.

#### **ISSUES AND CONCERNS:**

- A restrictive burn prescription is necessary to protect nearby residential, commercial and, transportation facilities likely to be otherwise impacted by smoke from a prescribed burn.
- Initiation of a prescribed burn in Units 1-5 will require the closure of GJMB and South Boundary Rd.
- Units 2/3 prepped in 2007. Weather conditions did not meet prescription for a prescribed burn in 2007.
- An update (2008) to existing plans and coordination is complete.
- Improvement of Unit 2/3 surrounding roadways to support prescribed burn control vehicles is complete.

## **MMRP Fieldwork Update**

#### PROJECT: MRS-BLM Units 18 and 22 Removal Action

An MMRP action is scheduled for a portion of MRS-BLM (Units 18 and 22) in 2008 in accordance with the Track 3 ROD. The area scheduled for removal is located in the northeast-most portion of the MRS-BLM. The area is divided into units of less than 100 acres for planning and control. Concurrence of Army's vegetation removal proposal by USF&WS has been completed. A Technical letter has been published to describe prescribed burn preparatory actions for the regulatory agencies. Vegetation cutting in fuel breaks is complete. Blacklining is not anticipated. Masticated areas (fuel breaks) will be burned with the respective units. Other preparatory actions (heli pad, Range 42 gate, and fuel break roadways) are complete.



- Excavation of select anomalies and the conduct of appropriate QC/QA processes




