Munitions and Explosives of Concern (MEC) Incident - Oscar Fire

August 29, 2009

Preliminary Investigation

A wildfire burned approximately 7 acres of moderate vegetation on the former Fort Ord on August 29, 2009 approximately 250m northeast of the intersection of Evolution Road and Broadway Ave. inside the Fort Ord impact area. The suspect cause was the unprovoked functioning of a Discarded Military Munitions (DMM) Grenade, Hand, Smoke, White Phosphorous, M15.

The wildfire was reported to the Presidio of Monterey Fire Department (POM FD) by Fire Comm at approximately 4:00 p.m. POM FD responded and discovered the fire to be coming from the impact area. POM FD controlled the fire with assistance from California Department of Forestry (CDF) aircraft and contained the acreage involved to approximately 7 acres. CDF had aircraft in the area enroute to another fire and offered to apply retardant. The application was authorized Chief Riso, POM FD.

The weather at the time of the initial response was clear with a temperature of approximately 80 degrees Fahrenheit, winds WSW at 12-17 mph, and 40% relative humidity. A ground fog developed as the response continued and persisted through much of the night. There was no evidence of flame after nightfall, however, smoldering continued and was monitored by the POM FD until the fire was declared out at 9:30 a.m. on August 31, 2009. There was no loss of equipment or structures, and no resulting injuries.

The area of the incident is part of an inactive multi-use range area of approximately 5, 600 acres of restricted, fenced, and patrolled Army property. The vegetation had burned last during a prescribed burn in 2003 and the area subject to a surface MEC removal. White Phosphorous grenade MEC has been previously located in the area of the incident (map attached).

A contract Senior Unexploded Ordnance Safety Officer conducted an initial inspection of the area identified by POM FD as the likely origin of the fire and identified the remnants of an expended Grenade, Hand, Smoke, White Phosphorous, M15 at that location. The remnants included an expended fuse with safety pin and lever intact. The safety officer detected the odor of phosphorous in vicinity of the remnants and concluded that the item had likely recently functioned. Oxidation of the grenade's body may have caused the function.


The function of the Grenade, Hand, Smoke, White Phosphorous, M15 when employed is to burst and disperse fragments of a solid filler that burns at a high temperature creating a dense white smoke for approximately 60 seconds (attached data sheet). Used for signaling, screening, and incendiary purposes. White Phosphorous will ignite and burn in the presence of an oxygen atmosphere without further cause. Grenades of this design have been in the Army's inventory for more than 50 years.

A collection and analysis of all available information regarding the incident will be conducted by the Army as part of the Fort Ord MRS Security Program. A report including recommendations for measures to address the potential for the future occurrence of such incidents will be provided to Fort Ord Base Realignment and Closure (BRAC) regulatory agencies.

M15 White Phosphorous grenade

The M15 White Phosphorous grenade is a bursting type grenade used for signaling, screening, and incendiary purposes.

- (1) Body -- sheet metal.
- (2) Filler -- 15 ounces of white phosphorus.
- (3) <u>Fuze</u> -- M206A2.
- (4) Weight -- 31 ounces.
- (5) <u>Capabilities</u> -- the average soldier can throw the grenade 30 meters. The grenade has a bursting radius of 17 meters. All friendly personnel within this 17-meter area should be in a covered position to avoid being struck by burning particles. The WP filler burns for about 60 seconds at a temperature of 5,000 degrees Fahrenheit. This intense heat causes the smoke produced by the grenade to rise quite rapidly, especially in cool climates. This makes the M15 grenade less desirable for use as a screening agent.
- (6) Color/markings -- grey with one yellow band and yellow markings.
- (7) <u>First aid</u> -- treat burns caused by WP in the same way as ordinary burns. If particles of WP are embedded in the flesh, immerse the wound in water or pack with wet cloths to halt combustion. Then pick out or squeeze out the WP. The particles will reignite spontaneously if allowed to dry. Apply copper sulphate solution to halt combustion of the WP particles. This permits them to be removed without igniting.

2009 Annual Review of the Fort Ord Munitions Response Site Prioritization Protocol

The Army conducted live-fire weapons training on areas of the former Fort Ord throughout its 70+ year history. As a result, some areas of the now-closed base are known or suspected to contain unexploded ordnance (UXO) and/or discarded military munitions (DMM). While the Army has made considerable progress in addressing the potential hazards associated with these munitions remaining from training activities, much remains to be done. Through direction provided by Congress in the Fiscal Year (FY) 2002 National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA), Department of Defense (DoD) was required to develop, in consultation with representatives of the States and Native Tribes, a protocol for assigning defense sites containing UXO, DMM, or Munitions Constituents (MC) a relative priority for response activities.

In response to this requirement, DoD developed the Munitions Response Site Prioritization Protocol (MRSPP) as the methodology for prioritizing sites known or suspected to containing UXO, DMM or MC for response actions. DoD developed the Protocol through a collaborative process with the States, American Indian and Alaskan Native Tribes, and federal agencies, collectively known as stakeholders. The Army applies the Protocol to known Munitions Response Sites (MRS).

The MRSPP uses a series of scores as applicable to the type and distribution of explosives, chemical contamination, and environmental conditions on each site. A combination of those scores result in a priority number that is then assigned to the site. The Army has applied the MRSPP to known Fort Ord MRS which are grouped into 22 range complexes based on site characteristics including location, type of explosives, removal action status/ past and future use, etc. (map on reverse). An annual review has been conducted for FY 2009 of the 22 range complexes as well as a reapplication of the Protocol where the status/condition of site has changed. The review and reapplication includes changes in property ownership, removal action status, known munitions types, safety factors, environmental hazard potential and additional guidance on prioritization.

The annual review of the MRSPP priority for Fort Ord MRS affords opportunities for stakeholders to participate in the Protocol's application. Community members with knowledge of the use, disposal or storage of munitions on the former Fort Ord, and/or habitat, communities, resources (water/soil/air) or facilities that may be impacted by the presence of munitions on the base can participate in the annual review of the site priority status through the Fort Ord Base Realignment and Closure (BRAC) Office. Community members may view the current status of all the 22 range complexes and the current Protocol Scoring Tables prepared by the Fort Ord BRAC Office for those MRS, which are maintained on the Fort Ord cleanup website (www.fortordcleanup.com).


