



FOSET 4 deed amendment:

- 1. November 2008 ROD for Del Rey Oaks MRA complete and signed.
- 2. June 2010 Per USEPA, CERCLA Warranty cannot be issued until variance to CRUP is complete.
- 3. July 2010 Del Rey Oaks submitted letter to DTSC requesting variance to the CRUP. Draft Final Remedial Design/Remedial Action Work Plan issued (28 Jul).
- 4. August 2010 USEPA determined all remedial actions implemented and completed (20 Aug).
- 5. September 2010 Del Rey Oaks retained surveyor. Draft deed amendment submitted to USACE.
- 6. November 2010 surveyor completed legal description.
- 7. March 2011 Del Rey Oaks forwarded legal description to DTSC, which started drafting CRUP variance.
- 8. April 2011 DTSC revised CRUP variance and submitted in draft for internal review. Determined variance process is complex and may do a CRUP amendment instead.
- 9. June 2011 DTSC CRUP amendment in progress. Evaluating who the signatories will be (likely DTSC and Del Rey Oaks) and the recordation process.
- 10. July 2011 DTSC submitted draft CRUP amendment/partial termination to Fort Ord BRAC for review on 11 July. BRAC responded with comments on 12 Jul. DTSC made additional revisions 19 Jul. Fort Ord BRAC made final changes and sent back to DTSC 20 Jul. DTSC in final review. Fort Ord BRAC recommended and DTSC accepted process for execution and recordation:
 - a. The City and DTSC execute the LUC amendment
 - b. Forward the executed LUC amendment to the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Sacramento District Real Estate Division (USACE SPK).
 - c. USACE SPK will attach the LUC amendment to the deed amendment and forward to FORA for execution.
 - d. FORA will sign the deed amendment and return the package to USACE SPK, who will forward to USACE HQ for execution.
 - e. Concurrently, FORA will prepare a deed amendment for execution by FORA and the City.
 - f. USACE will send the executed deed amendment and LUC amendment back to FORA for recordation.
 - g. FORA or the City will then record the deed amendment executed by them.

BLM North Triangle Area EM-61 Results

Status: Transects 1 through 5 have been completed using EM-61. All anomalies were investigated.


Transect Summaries:

- Transect 1 68 anomalies were identified and investigated. Two munitions debris items were
 discovered. Items included a Fuze, model 1907 (from a 75mm shrapnel projectile), and a
 grenade pull ring.
- Transect 2 43 anomalies were identified and investigated. Six munitions debris items, expended small arms blanks, several 7.62 bullets, and cultural debris including beer cans, and wire were discovered. The munitions debris included a practice rocket, a 105mm HE projectile, a grenade fuze, smoke grenade pieces, and an 81mm illumination mortar projectile.
- Transect 3 64 anomalies were identified and investigated. Nine munitions debris items were discovered. The items included an M74 air burst simulator, a M7A3 practice 2.36-inch rocket, a 75mm shrapnel piece from a MK 1 75mm shrapnel projectile, an illumination signal, a Model 1907 fuze, and fragments and tail fins from 81mm high explosive mortar projectiles (3 locations).
- Transect 4 42 anomalies were identified and investigated. One MEC item, one munitions debris item, and small arms items were discovered. The MEC item was a 2.36-inch high explosive 2.36-inch rocket, the munitions debris item was a M1907 combination projectile fuze.
- Transect 5 One munitions debris item and expended small arms ammunition was found. The munitions debris was tail fins from a 81mm M43 series high explosive mortar projectile.

MEC and munitions debris was found between 2 and 6 inches below ground surface.

Next Steps:

Complete review of data, further review of historical training maps and aerial photographs, review data from MRS-10A and compare munitions debris and MEC found. Identify Track 1/Track 2 boundary.
