ESCA Update:

DTSC described a teleconference with FORA concerning LUC annual reports. DTSC will send out a letter to the jurisdictions setting a deadline of Dec 31 for them to submit delinquent reports to FORA.

Community Relations: Army provided an update on community relations actions:

- 1. A Community Involvement Mobile Workshop was held on August 23 on the subjects of Munitions Response, Prescribed Burns, and ESCA. Community comments and suggestions were documented via comment cards and through staff notes.
- 2. A Technical Review Committee meeting was held on August 26 on the subjects of Munitions Response, Prescribed Burns, and ESCA.

- 3. The Army staffed a cleanup information booth at the Monterey County Fair on August 29.
- 4. National Public Radio was provided an interview (Bill Collins) and tour of the impact area on 18 September for a story to be broadcast later.

Property Transfer: The Army provided an update to current property transfer actions:

- 1. Finding of Suitability to Transfer (FOST) 11: No change.
- 2. FOST 12: No change.
- 3. Finding of Suitability for Early Transfer (FOSET) 4 CERCLA Warranty: No change.
- 4. Parcel L20.4 (Oil Well Rd) transfer to BLM: No change.

Fieldwork Update: The Army provided a handout and an update on recent and planned fieldwork:

- 1. A post MEC removal joint Army/BLM inspection of Units 7, 10 and 33 was completed in August. The results of the inspection will be included in the subject TM. An Army description of possible additional work in response to significant findings (if any) will be included in the subject RAR.
- 2. Surface MEC removal in WGBA unburned portions north and south is complete, with DGM approximately 70% complete. Tree density has slowed DGM.
- 3. Surface MEC removal is nearly complete in Unit 1. Vegetation cutting is complete in Unit 3.
- 4. The ESTCP has selected Fort Ord for a technology demonstration. The Army will include a status of the progress of the demonstration in future meetings.
- 5. DTSC will tour Units 1, 2, and 3 and other portions of the impact area with Army today.

MMRP Safety and Site Security: The Army provided a description of recent MEC and trespass incidents, community education events and related training.

- 1. There were 2 MEC incidents reported since the August meeting.
 - a. 15 September BLM staff reported a suspect mortar projectile in Unit 14 of the impact area during weed spraying. The item was investigated by contract MEC safety personnel and determined to be an expended (MD) projectile 81mm Illumination M301. The item was deposed in the MD bin for recycle.
 - b. 17 September BLM staff reported a suspect mortar projectile in Unit 14 for the impact area during weed spraying. The items was investigated by contract MEC safety personnel and determined to be an expended (MD) projectile 81mm illumination M301. The item was deposed in the MD bin for recycle.

Remaining RI/FS Areas: The Army provided an update on the status of the development of an RI/FS for the MRSs and adjoining property outside the impact area.

1. Final Track 2 RI/FS for BLM Area B and MRS-16 was published August 22.

2. The draft Track 2 Proposed Plan for BLM Area B and MRS-16, was published of the 25 August for 60 day review by the regulatory agencies. Agency comments are pending.

MRS-34 (FAAF): The Army continues to work to incorporate the Group 3 ROD dispute resolution language.

- 1. MRS-BLM Non-Burn Fuelbreaks TIP, draft The publication date is to be determined.
- 2. MRS-BLM Non-Burn 100ft Buffer South of BLM Headquarters (HQ) TIP, final is scheduled for publication September 26.
- 3. MRS Units 7 and 10 (2013 units), Prescribed Burn After Action Report, final, is to be published on September 3.
- 4. MRS-BLM Units 7, 10 and 33 (2013 units), Technical Memorandum, is to be published on October 24.
- 5. Track 2 ROD MRS-34 (FAAF), final, will be issued by September 30.
- 6. Track 2 RI/FS for BLM Area B and MRS-16, final, published August 25.
- 7. Track 2 Proposed Plan for BLM Area B and MRS-16, draft, published on August 25.
- 8. The annual surface monitoring for MRA surface remediation areas is scheduled for publication on September 30.

FFA Schedule: The FFA schedule for the Track 3 program and MRS-34 (FAAF) will be updated.

Action Items: Due action items were described as complete and pending items were reviewed.
