


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History of the ESCA

- The Army and Fort Ord Reuse Authority (FORA) entered into an Environmental Services Cooperative Agreement (ESCA) in 2007.
- The ESCA is a grant from the federal government providing cleanup funding to FORA for munitions cleanup on 3,340 acres of the former Fort Ord.
- The purpose of the FORA ESCA Remediation Program (RP) is to address residual safety issues associated with the former munitions training operations conducted on ESCA properties at the former Fort Ord.
- The FORA ESCA RP has increased munitions cleanup capacity on the former Fort Ord, providing for simultaneous munitions remediation on the Historical Impact Area and the ESCA properties (future economic development parcels).
- FORA Responsibilities under the ESCA:
 - Abide by state and federal regulations governing a Superfund site
 - Meet the same munitions remediation standards as the Army
 - Maintain a community outreach program
 - Monthly programmatic reporting to EPA



STATUS UPDATE : GROUP 1 MRAS SEASIDE MRA: RQA IMPLEMENTATION PROCESS



- Residential Quality Assurance (RQA) History
 - Munition investigation protocol established for designated future residential reuse
 - Must meet standards for DTSC protocol
 - Three tiered process; Levels 1, 2, 3
 - Protocol used to confirm acceptability for residential reuse

• Seaside MRA RQA Implementation

- Level 1 evaluation of previous cleanup
- Level 2 field verification where warranted
- Level 3 post scrape field verification of depth of detection where warranted
- RQA results reviewed by DTSC
- Additional Verification Requested By DTSC in January 2017
 - ✓ Seaside 01
 - ✓ Perform Level 2 in highlighted area
 - □ Analyze and document results of Level 2
 - □ Level 3 if warranted


- Field Activities
 - ✓ Brush cutting and removal
 - ✓ DGM survey and target investigation
 - Third party quality assurance
- Preliminary Results & Observations
 - 4 munitions items recovered and disposed of
 - Finds consist primarily of small pieces of nonmunitions related metal debris
 - Finds primarily limited to isolated areas with small pieces of munitions debris

• Data Analysis Criteria

- □ Evaluate explosive hazards
- □ Identify and resolve technical challenges
- □ Meet DTSC residential protocol
- □ Acceptable for residential reuse
- What's Next?
 - Documentation of results in supplemental technical report to support removal of residential use restriction
 - DTSC review

STATUS UPDATE: TRACK 2 PARKER FLATS MRA

EXPLANATION OF SIGNIFICANT DIFFERENCES AREA



Explanation of Significant Differences (ESD) Area

- Approximately 36 acres
- Located on the Track 2 Parker Flats MRA

Munitions Cleanup Actions

- MEC investigations and removal actions conducted
- Track 2 Parker Flats MRA ROD signed

Final Remedy: Land Use Controls

- MEC recognition and safety training
- Construction monitoring
- Residential use restrictions

Additional Evaluation

- Additional evaluation under DTSC residential protocol
- Acceptability for residential reuse verified
- Data supports removal of residential reuse restriction

Public Involvement Opportunities

- ESD Fact Sheet about remedy update
- Public meeting to brief community and collect verbal and written comments
- 30-day public comment period
